

Step-by-Step Adding Sound and Movies in Netscape Composer

You need to use an *HTML tag* to embed a movie or a sound in a page that you create using Netscape Composer. (But you don't need to know HTML to do it.)

To use Netscape Composer to embed a movie or a sound in a page, follow these instructions:

- 1** Make sure you have this Step-by-Step document open on your computer so that you can copy the text in step 3.
- 2** Locate the movie or sound you want to use and move it to the same folder as the page you want to work with.
- 3** Select the following HTML tag and choose Copy from the Edit menu:

```
<embed SRC="[myFileName]" WIDTH=[widthSize] HEIGHT=[heightSize]>
```

- 4** If the page you want to work with isn't already open, choose Open from the File menu, choose "Page in Composer" from the submenu, navigate to the page you want to use, then click Open.
- 5** Click where you want the movie or sound to appear, and choose HTML Tag from the Insert menu.
- 6** In the dialog box that appears, choose Paste from the Edit menu to paste the HTML tag you copied in step 3.
- 7** Select `[myFileName]` (including the square brackets) and replace it with the name of the sound or movie you want to use.

Leave the quotation marks undisturbed.

- 8** Select `[widthSize]` (including the square brackets) and replace it with the width you want to allow for your file. If you're embedding a sound file, use 100.
- 9** Select `[heightSize]` (including the square brackets) and replace it with the height you want to allow for your file. If you're embedding a sound file, use 100.

Tip: Width and height are measured in pixels, where 72 pixels = 1 inch. For movies, begin with WIDTH=100 and HEIGHT=100, preview the page, and then adjust the measurements as necessary.

- 10** When you're done, click OK.
- 11** Test the page in your favorite browser to make sure it's working the way you want it to.

Tip: If your browser reports that you need a special plug-in or it otherwise has trouble opening a sound or movie file, try ending the file name with “.mov” (for example, `barking.mov`). Remember to change the file name in the HTML tag to reflect the change. If this doesn't work, you may need to download a plug-in from the Internet. See the Netscape help system for information.
